

## FMCCS and Kiwanis Club SCI Duck Race

### Official Rules

1. The 2026 Duck Race Festival (Event) is presented by The Foundation of Monroe County Community Schools, a nonprofit organization under the Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and in partnership with the Kiwanis Club of South Central Indiana, a nonprofit organization under the Section 501(c)(4). (“Presenter”)
2. Participation in the Event constitutes Entrants full and unconditional acceptance of these Official Rules and the decisions of the Presenter, which are final and binding in all respects. Official rules are subject to change without notice. Receiving a prize is contingent upon fulfilling all requirements set forth herein. Conduct of the Raffle is subject to all applicable Indiana laws and regulations, specifically, the provisions of Indiana Code governing charity gaming found at Indiana Code art. 4-32.3.
3. The Duck Race Festival will start at 11:00 am on May 2, 2026, at the Woolery Mill in Bloomington, IN. The heats and race course will be held in the fountain as established by the race committee. The presenter reserves the right to postpone or reschedule the race or to determine the winners by random drawing in the event of inclement weather, Acts of God, or other circumstances beyond the control of the Presenter.
4. Duck adoption numbers are assigned by Rafflebox (an approved online vendor by IGS) and will be emailed to the purchaser. It is the responsibility of the purchasers to retain this number for their records.
5. Duck Adoptions can be made online at <https://www.rafflebox.us/raffle/fmccs> or **in-person** via credit card, check or cash or with an official adoption paper. All in-person adoptions must include an adoption paper completed in its entirety and delivered to the Presenter or an authorized representative of the Presenter or mailed to the Presenter at 315 North Drive, Bloomington IN 474041 and received by noon on Wednesday, April 29, 2026. In-person entries received after this date will not be eligible for entry or eligible to win prizes and the amount received by the presenter will be considered a donation to the Foundation of Monroe County Community Schools. Entrants assume the risk of non-delivery of any Entries to the Presenter or to an authorized representative of Presenter. In-person Duck adoptions will be manually entered into Rafflebox. All duck adoption numbers are assigned sequentially by Rafflebox at the time of purchase or manual entry by the operator. Assigned numbers are emailed to the purchaser. It is the responsibility of the purchaser(s) to retain this number for their records.
6. Duck adoptions **may** be available on the Event day and only sold online through Rafflebox. Day of adoptions sales will close at least 30 minutes before the first scheduled Heat.
7. Each duck sale will be assigned a number at time of purchase/entry through Rafflebox. This numbering is used to select raffle thirty (30) finalists during scheduled duck heats in the fountain at the Woolery Mill. The event operator will randomly pull duck(s) from the fountain and the finalist number is selected through Rafflebox. The finalists and adopter will be announced and advance to the final Duck Race. Chances of winning depends on the total number of qualified entries.

8. The final duck race will take place in the fountain. Ducks with the finalist number will be placed into the water. The first duck to cross the finish line or be plucked will be determined the winner. The Presenter reserves the right to “pluck” the duck if needed. Positive identification will be required to claim any prize(s). Winners will be notified in-person, by phone, email or US mail and must pick up their prize from the Presenter by May 31, 2026.
9. All ducks entered into the Event will be provided by the Presenter and will remain the property of the Presenter. No attempt to free or interfere with any ducks is permitted unless deemed necessary by the Duck Race Officials.
10. The Event is subject to all federal, state, and local laws and regulations.
11. Any and all federal, state and local taxes and fees on the prizes are the sole responsibility of the winner. Appropriate tax forms must be completed in full by the winner prior to receipt of a prize. No cash equivalent will be awarded in lieu of designated prizes.
12. By participating, Entrants release Present and its directors, officers, committee members managers, employees, volunteers, sponsors and Presenter related entities from any and all liability with respect to all prizes.
13. Entrants voluntarily assume all risks and damage of bodily injury, damage to personal property and all other hazards arising from or related in any way to the Event, whether occurring prior to, during or after the Event, whether on Event site or in surrounding parking area, whether or not due to negligence of Presenter , its directors, officers, committee members, managers, employee, volunteers, Presenter related entities, sponsor, the Woolery Mill and agrees to release Present, Woolery Mill and their respective directors, officers, committee member, managers, employees, volunteers, and sponsors from any claims or liabilities arising from the Event.
14. Prizes will be awarded “as is” Presenter reserves the right, in its sole discretion to substitute prizes of comparable value.
15. Employees, Board Members, and Officers of the Presenter are not eligible to win prizes.
16. Rules for the \$50,000 number chance are governed by the insurance contract.
17. By entering, winners consent to the promotional use of their names and likenesses without notification, approval or additional compensation.
18. All decisions and interpretations of rules, regulations and final determination of winners shall be made by the Presenter and its judgment is final.
19. In case of bad weather or unforeseen circumstances preventing the running of the race, ducks will be selected randomly, and winners will be notified as stated in rule 2.
20. Winners need not be present to win. Winners will be announced following the Event and following Rules 7 and 8, if the Presenter is unable to contact the winner due to insufficient or illegible contact information, or if a winner is deemed ineligible to win, Presenter will select a substitute winner by random drawing of Entries. All prizes will be awarded. Prize winners must be individuals and 18 years or older. Winners must show proper identification when claiming a prize. Winners must provide the necessary information for tax documents to claim their prize. Prizes may not be substituted or exchanged.

23. The 2026 Duck Race is a licensed fundraising event of the Presenter. Presenter's logos are registered trademarks of the Presenter and no other person or entity is authorized to copy or otherwise use them without the expressed written consent of Presenter.
24. Entrants must be individuals at least 18 years or older and tickets must be purchased in the state of Indiana.
